\$20,010.00 in grants awarded to local organizations

Operation Round Up Program- "Small Change Makes a BIG Difference"

The WIN Energy REMC Community Trust recently presented six grants totaling \$20,010.00 awarded to the following organizations:

- **Council on Domestic Abuse, Inc.** received **\$10,000** toward the purchase of new playground equipment for their facility.
- **Petersburg Police Department** received **\$4,200** towards the purchase of speed check radar signs.
- **Pike County 4-H Council** received **\$5,810** to upgrade the fairground electrical equipment.

The Operation Round Up program allows WIN Energy REMC members to reach out to worthy causes in their communities and work together to help others. Thank you to those members who round up their electric bills to the next highest dollar each month. Since the inception of the program in May 2013, 92 grants have been awarded to local organizations totaling over \$301,760. Your small change is really making a big difference for organizations in our community.

Grants are awarded quarterly, with the next round of grants being awarded in March. **Applications are due by February 1st** to be considered for the March disbursement. Any charitable organization within the WIN Energy REMC service territory is eligible to apply. The organization does not have to be a member of WIN Energy REMC. 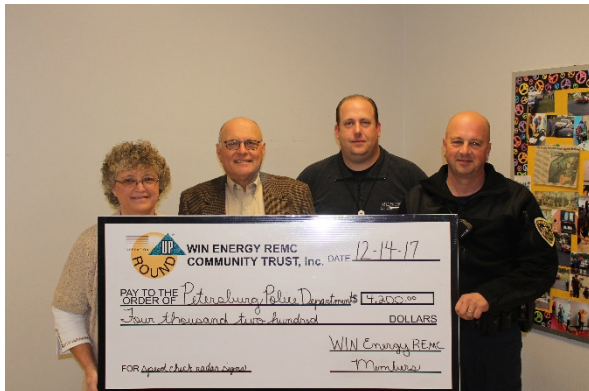
